The Yard Hotel, Berlin

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IN THE MIDDLE of Berlin's too-cool-for-school Kreuzberg district, this boutique hotel is a bright light in a sea of moody black. Step off the overheated streets and into the landscaped garden – the perfect prelude to the interior's soothing minimalism, with 55 tranquil beige-and-olive rooms that feel like a sigh of relief. The one for... Food, glorious food

Ergon House, Athens

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THIS 'FOODIE HOTEL' sits atop a Greek agora, so you can summon market-fresh delicacies like cheese and truffle peinirli with a flourish of your finger on the room-service button. For a little late-night action, the minibar (mini-deli, actually) is chock-full of Greek artisanal delicacies – just leave room for breakfast the next morning, which is included in your stay.



The one for... Feeling theatrical

Hotel Sanders, Copenhagen

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WITHIN PIROUETTING DISTANCE of the Royal Danish Theatre, you'll find Danish ballet dancer Alexander Kølpin's boutique townhouse hotel. The whole place is all about understated Scandi luxury (oh, go on then, hygge). The rooms are similarly elegant, with furniture you'll want to take home, and ground-floor cocktail bar Tata is the perfect spot for a nightcap.



The one for... Grown-up hedonists

Monkey Island Estate, London

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IN THE 60S, this 800-year-old retreat hosted wild soirées for A-list guests. Now, like a socialite coming out of her party-hard years, she's cleaning up her act: a three-year renovation has yielded 30 beautifully restored rooms and suites, a pool house and a spa. She still has a glint in her eye, though: the bar in the original 15th-century manor is all bon-vivant glam.
